



Summer Litigation Program (1st STEP) Application Instructions Summer Semester

Summer Trial Evidence & Advocacy Program (1st STEP) Description – 11 Units

Golden Gate University, School of Law and its Litigation Center present “1st STEP” (Summer Litigation Program), an integrated summer litigation curriculum for students who recently completed their first year of law school. Experienced faculty and practitioners lead 1st STEP law students in advanced trial advocacy training at the earliest opportunity in their legal studies. This selective, innovative, 9-week summer program offers a series of integrated Evidence, Trial Advocacy, and Motions courses specifically designed to improve student litigation and presentation skills. The program also includes three uniquely designed Litigation Center courses: Evidence in the Courtroom, Presentation and Persuasion Skills, and Motions Writing and Advocacy.

This specialized litigation training program offers 11 units during the summer session, giving students greater freedom and a competitive advantage to participate in: full-time employment, the GGU National Trial Team, moot court competitions, GGU on-site clinics, externship and internship programs, as well as other GGU litigation programs during the fall semester. The 1st STEP program begins the last week or two of May each year.

Eligibility

All 1L students are eligible and invited to apply for admission. Part-time evening students are also eligible, but are required to attend the day program full-time for 9-weeks during their second summer. All 1st STEP applicants must maintain a minimum 2.5 required course GPA to gain acceptance. The criteria for selection to the program are:

- a) Success in law school;
- b) Interest and enthusiasm for advocacy training (including participation in *In Vino Veritas*, 1L Cross and Close Competition, and other Litigation Center events/lectures);
- c) Admittance into the “Introduction to Litigation” 1L Spring Elective; and
- d) Ability to perform effectively in a professional setting.

Pre-admission

The 1st STEP Program is a highly selective program, admitting only 24 of the most qualified and passionate future litigators. As such, students with an excellent undergraduate GPA may apply to be pre-admitted upon acceptance to GGU School of Law. Completed applications must be received no later than **5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 16, 2020** to be considered for the 2021 1st STEP Program. II. In-Person Interview. Upon receipt of your application materials, the Litigation Center *may* schedule interviews. The Baxter Fellow will contact you for all interviews.

III. Commitment Letter. Applicants will be required to submit to the Litigation Center a copy of their transcript from their fall semester, as well as a written commitment that you will be participating in the Summer Litigation Program (1st STEP) by mid-February.
